


COVID-19 in St. Tammany


As of May 19, 2020:

St. Tammany Total Confirmed COVID-19 Cases




- 5th highest number of positive cases in Louisiana

Unemployment Insurance Claims

- From March 15 to May 9, a total of **34,430** St. Tammany residents filed for unemployment.
- This number indicates that more than a quarter of the workforce is out of work.
- 4th highest number of UI claims in the state
- UI claims reached their peak during the week of March 30-April 3, with 5,952 claims filed that week.






Unemployment Insurance Claims

Statewide, the hardest-hit industries in terms of lost jobs have been **Accommodation & Food Service**, representing 21.7% of all claims filed; **Health Care and Social Assistance** (11.9%); **Retail Trade** (11.9%); and **Construction** (8.7%).


Louisiana Statewide UI Claims by Industry

Statewide, the hardest-hit industries during the pandemic, as shown on the previous page, have been proportional to St. Tammany's industrial makeup.



COVID-19 Vulnerability Index


- The **Vulnerability Index** is a measurement of the negative impact that the pandemic can have on employment based upon a region's industrial and economic makeup.
- For example, Accommodation & Food Services are projected to lose more jobs as a result of the coronavirus (over half of jobs lost, on average) compared to other industries that are expected to have mild or no job contractions.
 - As shown on the previous page, Accommodation & Food Service jobs make up nearly one quarter of all jobs in St. Tammany.
- The average county Vulnerability Index score is 100, representing the average job loss expected in the United States. Higher scores indicate the degree to which job losses may be greater.
- St. Tammany's Index score: 117.44 highly vulnerable
 - **17.44%** higher than the national average for potential job loss
- St. Tammany's Ranking: 279th most vulnerable out of 3,141 counties in the U.S.
 - **Top 10%** most vulnerable counties/county-equivalents





CARES Act

- The CARES Act is the largest federal relief package ever passed by Congress, with \$2 trillion in stimulus funds distributed across seven main areas, with a second round of funding totaling \$310 billion.
- One of the main tools for helping small businesses, the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), has resulted in more than 63,000 loans totaling nearly \$8 billion for Louisiana businesses as of May 15.
- Louisiana ranks 9th in the nation for approved loans per 10,000 businesses.
- In addition to \$1200 direct payments to most Americans, those who are eligible for unemployment benefits receive an extra \$600 weekly benefit on top of the amount the individual is entitled to receive under state law.


Residential Travel Since Stay-at-Home Order

The purpose of the community mobility report is to give insight into key questions:

- How have travel and mobility in St. Tammany been impacted by the pandemic?
- How well has St. Tammany adhered to the stayat-home order?
- Where are people going when they aren't going to work, going shopping, or doing leisure/entertainment activities?

Definitions:

- Retail & Recreation: places like restaurants, cafes, shopping centers, theme parks, museums, libraries, and movie theaters
- Grocery & Pharmacy: places like grocery markets, food warehouses, farmers markets, specialty food shops, drug stores, and pharmacies
- Parks: places like national parks, public beaches, marinas, dog parks, plazas, and public gardens
- Workplaces: places of work
- Residential: places of residence





Economic Impact PlanningVulnerable Population

- Age and pre-existing social vulnerability, e.g.
 poverty and chronic health conditions, could be
 two factors that help provide a basis for potential
 impacts of the health crisis in our community.
- At least one person with a disability lives in about
 10% of St. Tammany households.
- According to Feeding America, 9.2% of people in St. Tammany were food insecure before the pandemic and economic downturn.
- 3,334 households, or an estimated **9,000** or more people, do not have reliable transportation.




Economic Impact Planning

Over-65 Population

- St. Tammany has about 40,000 senior adult residents, which is 15.9% of the total population.
- St. Tammany has the **4**th **highest** over-65 population in the state.
- In Louisiana, the highest number of deaths,
 1,576, is in the over-70 age category.
- According to the CDC, 8 out of 10
 deaths reported in the U.S. have been
 adults 65 years old and older.

Economic Impact Planning

Commuting Patterns

- St. Tammany's commuting patterns reinforce how important a careful, gradual reopening is to protecting workers and families from infection.
- On a typical day, more than 45,000 St. Tammany residents leave the parish for work and return home, while at the same time, more than 32,000 non-residents commute into the parish for work and return to their homes elsewhere.
- Upon a full return to normal working conditions, the high mobility of St. Tammany's residents and workforce could present a challenge in slowing the spread of disease.
